- 8. CHOOSE Whenever I fly, I usually <u>choose</u> to sit in an aisle seat.
- 9. CLAIM Frank *claims to have* seen an alien.
- 10.CONTINUE (also gerund) My father <u>continues</u> to read newspapers despite having internet access.
- 11.DECIDE After my break-up, I <u>decided to live</u> with my parents for a few months.
- 12.DEMAND The customer <u>demanded</u> to speak to the manager.
- 13.DESERVE Leonardo di Caprio <u>deserved</u> to win an Oscar for The Revenant.
- 14.EXPECT I'm <u>expecting</u> Carlo to bring his girlfriend with him.
- 15.FORGET Don't *forget to send* your grandma a birthday message.
- 16.HATE (also gerund) My dog <u>hates</u> to get wet. I can never walk him in the rain.
- 17.HOPE I hope to visit the Uffizi Gallery in Florence.
- 18.INTEND Doug and I *intend* to *paint* our bedroom red this weekend.
- 19.LEARN I *learnt* to cook from my grandmother.
- 20.LIKE (also gerund) I <u>like to drink</u> coffee with maple syrup. It's odd, I know.
- 21.LOVE (also gerund) My wife and I <u>love</u> to play cards on a rainy day.
- 22.MANAGE Did you *manage to book* an appointment with Dr. Boyle?
- 23.NEED Oh my goodness Frank, you <u>need</u> to brush your teeth.
- 24.OFFER My date <u>offered</u> to pay for the meal. I was incredibly grateful.
- 25.PLAN I can't believe my parents are *planning* to sell my childhood home.
- 26.PREFER (also gerund) I usually prefer to walk to work rather than drive.
- 27.PREPARE <u>Prepare</u> to be amazed!
- 28.PRETEND Come on Adam, stop *pretending to have* a British accent.
- 29.PROMISE I promise to always love you.
- 30.REFUSE My son <u>refuses</u> to eat vegetables.
- 31.REGRET I <u>regret</u> to inform you that your loan request has been denied.
- 32.REMEMBER I'm so relieved that I <u>remembered</u> to bring my passport.
